BP's new T&T gas project and discoveries 'could ease ALNG supply woes'

BP has sanctioned the Angelin gas project offshore Trinidad and Tobago and unearthed new offshore gas discoveries, both of which could potentially alleviate long-running supply constraints at the 15 mtpa Atlantic LNG facility.

The Angelin development will boost flagging domestic gas production by 600 MMcf/day when it comes online in 2019. The project requires a new offshore platform – BP's fifteenth in the country – located 60 km off the Caribbean island nation's south-east coast.

Four production wells will also be drilled, starting in Q3 2018. Gas from Angelin will be transported to ...
